

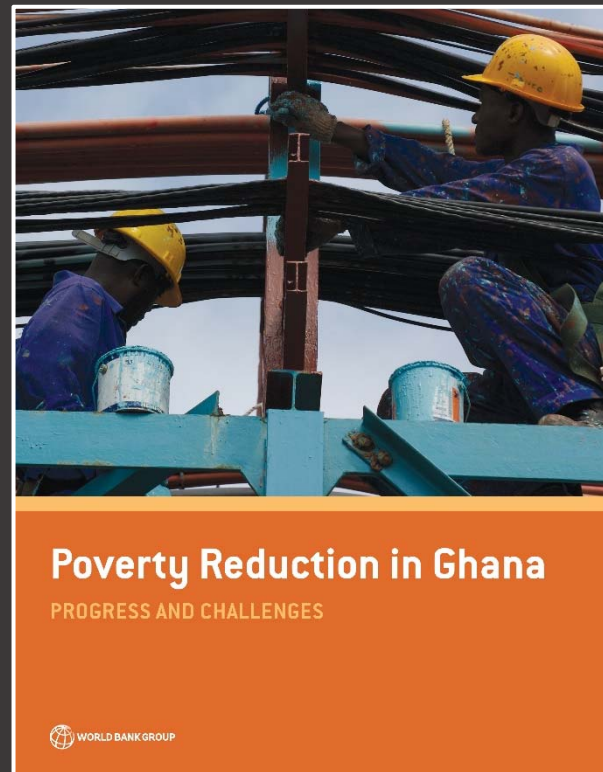
# Evidence-based analysis for poverty reduction in Ghana

## WORKSHOP

Ghana has achieved two remarkable successes since 1990: it has halved poverty and produced regular and comparable data with which to monitor progress.

Few Sub-Saharan countries have managed to reduce poverty so quickly and at such a steady rate. Having the capacity to monitor this progress by using high quality and comparable surveys is also an achievement.

At the workshop, academics, policy makers and representatives of international organizations will present recent findings on poverty reduction in Ghana, discuss the drivers of the success, highlight future challenges and opportunities, and discuss how lessons learnt from Ghana can be useful for other developing countries.
